CA AB 1472 Leno (D) SUPPORT	Public Health: Healthy Places Act of 2008 Establishes the California Healthy Places Act of 2008. Requires various state agencies and departments to collaboratively support childhood development, prevent injury, illness, and chronic disease, ensure environmental health, and reduce health disparities by providing knowledge, guidance and resources for public health assessments of land use and transportation system planning. CA AB 1860 Huffman (D) SUPPORT	Unsafe Products: Recall or Warning Prohibits a commercial dealer, manufacturer, importer, distributor, wholesaler or retailer from manufacturing, remanufacturing, retrofitting, distributing selling at wholesale or retail, contracting to sell or resell, leasing or subletting or otherwise placing into the stream of commerce, a product that is unsafe, knowing the product is unsafe. Provides recall notification requirements. Requires providing for the safe return of the product to the manufacturer. CA AB 2115 Mullin (D) GUTTED/DROP	Childhood Lead Screening Prohibits the governing board of a school district from unconditionally admitting any person who is 6 years of age or younger as a pupil of any private or public elementary or secondary school, child care center, day nursery, nursery school, family day care home, or development center, unless the pupil has a certificate showing that he or she has been evaluated for lead poisoning. Authorizes the adoption of regulations governing a risk assessment and/or blood screening for lead poisoning by a nurse. Charter Schools: Governing Boards Requires charter schools to adopt and comply with a conflict-of-interest policy to include specified requirements set forth in existing law. Sets the eligibility qualifications to be elected or appointed to a charter school governing board. Prohibits a school employee from serving unless they resign employment. Relates to board term limits and board member voting requirements. CA AB 2547 Leno (D) WATCH	Oil Spill Prevention and Response Revises the definition of dedicated response resources under the Lempert-Keene Seastrand Oil Spill Prevention and Response Act to provide that, for the port areas of San Francisco, Los Angeles, Long Beach and San Diego, dedicated response resources shall additionally mean equipment and personnel permanently located in each of those areas. CA AB 2599 De Leon (D) WATCH	Birth Defects Monitoring Program Relates to the Birth Defects Monitoring Program. Revises fees for prenatal screening to support pregnancy blood sample storage, testing, and research activities. Requires guidelines for invoicing, charging and collecting from approved researchers an amount necessary to cover certain expenses of the program. CA AB 2935 Huffman (D) SUPPORT	Oil Spill Prevention and Response Requires the environmentally and ecologically sensitive element of the State Toxic Spill Contingency Plan to include the identification and prioritization of sensitive areas, a plan for protective actions, the location of emergency response equipment and personnel, and a program for testing strategies in such areas. Requires the closure of certain waters to the taking of all fish and shellfish if a public health threat exists. Requires contamination determinations. CA AB 2999 Huffman (D) SUPPORT	Animal Carcasses: Removal From Highways Authorizes the state or local agency having jurisdiction of a highway to remove an accidental take from the highway. CA SB 356 Negrete McLeod (D) NEUTRAL	List of Reportable Diseases and Conditions Deletes the requirement of the Department of Health to establish a specified list of required reportable diseases and conditions by a local health officer. Requires the department to establish a list of reportable diseases and conditions for which clinical laboratories are required to submit a culture or specimen to the local and state public health laboratories. CA SB 1122 Correa (D)	Mobilehome Parks Authorizes the Department of Housing and Community Development to establish an effort to provide a stepped-up level of enforcement to resolve violations that are an imminent threat to health and safety in mobilehome parks within the agency's jurisdiction. Revises the duties of an existing related task force. Revises the membership of the task force. CA SB 1206 Calderon R (D) WATCH	Pest Control Relates to regulation of registered structural pest control companies by the Structural Pest Control Board. CA SB 1386 Lowenthal (D) WATCH	Residential Building Safety Requires the Fire Marshal to approve carbon monoxide devices for use in dwelling units intended for human occupancy and charge fees. Requires the installation of such device. Provides a violation is an infraction. Requires an owner or owner's agent of a dwelling who rents or leases space to a tenant to test and maintain such devices. Permits an owner to enter a unit to install, repair or test the alarms. CA AB 1605 Lieber (D) WATCH	State Department of Public Health: Public Health Nurse Requires the Director of the State Department of Public Health to appoint one of the chief deputies as the State Public Health Nurse, who shall be a licensed public health nurse, to act as a liaison to public health nursing agencies in addition to other duties. CA AB 2765 Huffman (D) WATCH	Pest Eradication: Aerial use of Pesticide Requires the Secretary of Food and Agriculture or County Agricultural Commissioner, before the aerial application of a pesticide in an urban area when an eradication plan indicates same, to conduct at least one public hearing to consider all alternatives to aerial application of a pesticide and to seek an evaluation of human health risks and environmental risks jointly, including findings and recommendations on use of aerial application of a pesticide. CA AB 97 Mendoza (D) NEUTRAL	Food Facilities: Trans Fat Requires every food facility, except a school cafeteria, to maintain on the label for any food or food additive that is or includes any fat, oil, or shortening, for as long as this food or food additive is stored, distributed, or served by, or used in the preparation of food within, the food facility. Prohibits, on or after a specified date, oil, shortening, or margarine containing specified trans fats for specified purposes, from being stored, distributed, or served by, or used in the preparation of food.	7/25/2008 • Signed by the Governor. CA AB 1773 Hayashi (D) SUPPORT AS AMENDED	Retail Food: Long-Term Health Care Facilities Requires the Director of the State Department of Public Health to review and to make a specified determination as to the equivalency of certain facility licensing surveys and regulatory requirements in ensuring the adequacy of food safety and dietary services, consistent with the food-borne illness prevention and public health intervention goals of the State Retail Food Code that are used by local enforcement agencies to survey food facilities, and the need for recommendations. CA AB 1846 Adams (R) WATCH	Inedible Kitchen Grease Exempts from an additional fee assessed by the Department of Food and Agriculture transporters of inedible kitchen grease who transport such grease for their own personal, noncommercial use as an alternative fuel. Requires those persons to pay an additional fee per year per vehicle that is used to transport the grease. Requires these individuals to meet other requirements.	7/10/2008 • Enrolled.
CA AB 1966 Garcia (R) DEAD	Schools: Pupil Nutrition: School Breakfast Requires each school site that enrolls more than a specified number of pupils and that meets the qualifications for federal severe need reimbursement to offer, in addition to existing meal programs, a nutritionally adequate breakfast that qualifies for federal payments beginning in a specified school year. Authorizes grant waivers of this requirement if the school district or county office of education declares that the operation of the program is infeasible financially. CA AB 2128 Emmerson (R) WATCH	Health Facilities: Dietitians Requires specified health facilities employ a full-, part-time or consulting dietitian. Requires facilities that employ a registered dietitian full time to also employ a full-time dietetic services supervisor. Requires the supervisor to receive frequently scheduled consultation from a qualified dietitian and to meet educational requirements. Allows the department to issue a program flexibility request to a facility to exempt from the educational requirements for certain supervisors.	8/1/2008 • Signed by the Governor. CHAPTER 225
CA AB 2168 Jones (D) SUPPORT AS AMENDED	Farm Stands: Direct Marketing: Retail Food Authorizes the adoption of regulations to encourage direct sale by farmers to the public of all types of agricultural products. Authorizes field retail and farm stands located near the point of production to engage in similar direct marketing. Establishes farm stands as another form of direct marketing outlet. Requires the information displayed, to include, in addition, the identity of the source from which the water was last obtained prior to being bottled. CA AB 2194 Garcia (R) DEAD	Food Facilities Makes technical nonsubstantive changes to the California Uniform Retail Food Facilities Law that provides for the regulation of health and sanitation standards for retail food facilities by the State Department of Health Care Services and is primarily enforced by local health agencies. CA AB 2253 Torrice (D) DEAD	Food Labels: Free Range Requires the Department of Food and Agriculture to develop a criteria for the use of the claim California Certified Free Range for poultry products. Authorizes poultry and poultry products that comply with those criteria to bear the words, or be held out as California Certified Free Range before being offered for sale.	4/3/2008 • In ASM Agriculture Committee.
CA AB 2300 Laird (D) WATCH	School Lunch and Breakfast Programs: Certification Amends existing law relating to direct certification for enrollment in the School Lunch and Breakfast Program. Permits the State Department of Education to directly certify children into the school meal program. Authorizes the Department of Health Care Services to exchange the information necessary to verify eligibility. Authorizes the department to perform direct certification and enrollment of children. CA SB 200 Florez (D) WATCH	Food Safety Requires establishments that slaughter cattle for beef, whether the establishment is state or federal inspected, to install video surveillance in the areas where cattle are present. Makes it unlawful to tamper with the surveillance or resulting recordings. Requires that state officials have access to live surveillance. CA SB 201 Florez (D) WATCH	Dairy Farms: Raw Milk: Testing: Standards Provides alternative requirements for dairy farms that produce and process guaranteed raw milk, or Grade A raw milk, to be sold to the consumer. Requires a dairy farm that produces and processes raw milk to develop and maintain a Hazard Analysis Critical Control Points plan. Requires training for dairy farm employees on the plan. CA SB 1354 Torlakson (D) WATCH	School Facilities Construction Requires the Superintendent of Public Instruction to examine and evaluate the ability of a school district to build complete schools with the funds provided by the State Allocation Board and an equal amount contributed by the district to examine the standards to ensure the standards achieve educational adequacy in the terms of the facilities necessary for a district to provide its program, assessing the level that school constructed with state money met adequacy in terms of the facilities necessary.	7/14/2008 • SEN Concurrence.
CA SB 1359 Runner G (R) SPONSOR/SUPPORT	Retail Food Facilities Amends the Retail Food Code. Redefines prepackaged food, vermin, egg, cold water, frozen food and produce stand. Relates to child day care facilities, residential care facilities, food dating and labeling, food distribution facilities, food facility employees, local health officers and enforcement agencies, the storage of food, equipment, or supplies in a toilet room, heating and cooling of food, and sanitization of equipment.	6/30/2008 • Enrolled.
CA SB 1369 Cedillo (D)	Pupil Nutrition: Free and Reduced Price Meals Prohibits a school district from sharing information on a free or reduced price school lunch program application if the district possesses data indicating the child already has an active Medi-Cal or Healthy Families case. CA SB 1420 Padilla (D) NEUTRAL	Food Facilities: Nutritional Information Amends CalCode to require each food facility that meets specified criteria to provide nutritional information that includes, per standard menu item, the total number of calories, grams of carbohydrates, grams of saturated fat, grams of trans fat, and milligrams of sodium. Requires the menu boards to include the total number of calories for each listed item. CA SB 1443 Oropeza (D) WATCH	Food Facilities: Donated Food Requires every written contract entered into by a retail food facility to prepare, provide, or serve food for immediate human consumption to include language that provides the purchaser of the food with the option of authorizing the food facility to donate any leftover food to a nonprofit food bank or charitable organization, or to provide all leftover food to the purchaser. CA SB 1575 Florez (D) DEAD	Consumer Product Recall Enforcement Establishes the Consumer Product Recall Protection and Enforcement Act. Prohibits the manufacture, production or selling of a consumer product subject to a recall, knowing that the product is subject to recall. Prohibits any person from importing, receiving, or delivering to any other person, or manufacturing, producing, selling, or offering for sale, any consumer product subject to a recall. CA AB 558 Feuer (D) WATCH DEAD	Chemical Substances: Testing Enacts the State Chemical Substances Act. Requires the Department of Toxic Substances Control to identify and recommend the most accurate and effective methods to use to test for and evaluate the potential hazard traits of chemical substances. Requires the department to review and assess new and emerging testing methods. Requires the department to make available to the public an information matrix that compiles information regarding those traits. Requires an annual review of the testing methods and matrix. CA AB 1183 Hancock (D) NEUTRAL/SUPPORT *	Hazardous Materials: Cortese List Requires the Department of Toxic Substances Control to make available on its public Internet Web site specified information and lists, including a list of all land use restriction instruments and agreements required to be maintained and posted. Requires the Department of Public Health to make available on its public Internet Web site a list of contaminated public drinking water wells. Requires such information to be updated at least annually. Requires the department to provide telephone contact numbers. NOTE: DTSC sponsored. Contact Hans Hemann	6/21/2007 • On SEN Floor.
CA AB 1391 Brownley (D) WATCH 2 YEAR BILL *	Electronic Waste Requires a retailer that sells an electronic device covered under the Electronic Waste Recycling Act to provide information to a customer at the point of sale of that device that includes the State Integrated Waste Management Board's Web site address. Requires the website to describe where and how to return, recycle, and dispose of a covered electronic device and locations for the collection or return of the device. CA AB 1879 Feuer (D) WATCH ***	Hazardous Materials: Toxic Substances Authorizes the Department of Toxic Substances Control to regulate the use of a chemical of concern in a consumer product or restrict the sale or use of such product. Requires a manufacturer of a product containing such chemicals to affix a label indicating the chemical and its health effects. Allows funds in the Toxic Substances Control Account to be used for the regulation of a chemical of concern in a consumer product or the restriction of the sale or use of such consumer product. CA AB 1946 Nava (D) WATCH **	Hazardous Materials: Water Quality: Enforcement Relates to actions regarding hazardous materials release response plans. Authorizes a regional board to delegate to its executive officer the authority to apply for judicial enforcement under the Porter-Cologne Water Quality Act to the Attorney General, a district attorney, a city attorney of a city with a specified population, or a city attorney for a city and county. CA AB 2170 Cook (R) WATCH DEAD	Fireworks Makes it a misdemeanor to possess, manufacture, sell, use, or discharge, or to offer to do so, any type of fireworks, including safe and sane fireworks, in any high or very high fire hazard severity zone. CA AB 2286 Feuer (D) SUPPORT ***	Unified Hazardous Waste and Hazardous Materials Requires the Secretary for Environmental Protection to increase the hazardous waste and hazardous materials management oversight surcharge by an amount necessary to establish an information data collection and exchange system as part of the unified hazardous waste and hazardous materials management regulatory program. Requires technical assistance to regulated businesses relating to electronic reporting requirements. Requires a specified federal facility to pay the increased surcharge as authorized by law. CA AB 2347 Ruskin (D) SUPPORT **	Mercury-Added Thermostats: Collection Program Enacts the Mercury Thermostat Collection Act. Requires a manufacturer of thermostats sold in the state to establish and maintain a collection and recycling program. Requires manufacturer educational and outreach efforts, specified recycling rates, revision of the collection and recycling program and wholesaler requirement to act as collection location. Provides contractor handling requirements, a survey and an out-of-service collection bin. Prohibits thermostat sales by a manufacturer not in compliance. CA AB 2505 Brownley (D) WATCH/SUPPORT **	Hazardous waste: Polyvinyl Chloride Packaging Container Amends the Toxics in Packaging Prevention Act. Prohibits a person from manufacturing, importing, selling, or distributing a polyvinyl chloride packaging container in the state. Requires persons who manufacture, import, sell, or distribute plastic packaging containers to furnish a certificate of compliance to the purchaser of such containers.
